SAMUEL H. CHAPMAN

This short run of catalogues (28) from 1907 to 1924 is one of the most challenging series to complete. This is evidenced by the fact that \$9,000 was paid for a plated 1920 Hunter sale in the early 1980 s. This record was broken after the Henry Chapman bid-book of the 1912 George Earle sale brought \$9,500. As of June 2000 a new record of \$12,000 was established for a plated 1923 Henderson sale. Matthew A. Stickney (1805 — 1894) was the first person to own an 1804 dated Silver Dollar in this country. It was secured through a trade with William E. DuBois, who was the Curator of the Mint collection and Assistant Assayer. All 1804 Dollars (other than the ones in the State Department ordered Presentation Sets in 1834-5), whether so-called Originals, Restrikes, or Electrotypes, appeared on the market between 1842 and 1876, while DuBois was still alive. This gives credibility to my theory that he alone was responsible for their creation, regardless of how they were distributed.
