SCARCE EARLY BLUEBOOKS

The popularity of the Redbook has overshadowed Yeoman's other signature publication, that being the Bluebook, which is much more scarce than the Redbook ever thought of being. More and more people are putting together a Redbook set. This is due primarily to the publication of a price guide in the latest editions of the Redbook. The Bluebooks present more challenge in completing a set because of several overprints and cover variants in the early issues. Get a head start on the Redbook collectors and fill in your Bluebooks now.

Bluebook, 2nd Edition, 1943, VERY FINE, This copy displays strong gilt on the front cover. The binding is tight, the pages clean and fresh. There is no writing anywhere. The only minor defects are a 1/8th inch indent on the front cover and some discoloration on the upper rear. This is somewhat scarce in this condition and should prove to be a wise purchase at **95.**

Bluebook, 4th Edition, 1945, Rare Black Cover Variant. Owner's name on free fly. A few small spots on the front cover. Otherwise a very presentable example of this much sought after, early "bluebook", which is presently unknown in Near Mint condition. If anyone has such an animal, I'd gladly pay \$150. This one is offered at **60.**

CANADIAN NUMISMATIC JOURNAL: An important run of early issues. Volume 1, 1956 - Volume 16, 1971, missing 1963, 1964, & 1965. Ten years from '56 to '68 are **hardbound** in red with gilt spines and were bound by the Canadian Numismatic Association. The 1969 through 1971 are mint copies in their original covers.
