RARITIES

1883 – *EARLY HALF DIMES* by HAROLD NEWLIN. Hardbound in original maroon cloth and boards with gilt. One of 40 plated copies out of 100 total. Fine..... \$1300.

1913 – *MALCOLM JACKSON* sale by UNITED STATES COIN CO. Deluxe Hardbound, blue cloth and boards with gilt. Plated w/16 *superb* plates. Very Fine... \$1900.

1946 – *WILLIAM C. ATWATER* sale by B. MAX MEHL. Hardbound in blue cloth and boards (there were no hardbound copies done by Mehl). This is one of the top three Mehl blockbuster sales. Comes with an original prices realized list. Very Fine..... \$545.

1849 – *A MANUAL OF GOLD AND SILVER COINS OF ALL NATIONS STRUCK WITHIN THE PAST CENTURY* by ECKFELDT & DuBOIS. The rare 1849 edition with samples of real '49er gold on p. 235. Original hardcover marbled boards, front board loose, contents fine. Less than ten copies known. The rebound Ford example sold for over \$9,000 in 2004. Very Good..... \$6950.

1881 – *A HISTORICAL SKETCH OF THE COINS OF NEW JERSEY WITH A PLATE* by EDWARD MARIS. LARGE FOLIO. Blue pebbled leather hard-covered boards with spine missing in places (typical). Two of the text pages are torn across and need repaired. The two-page plate is nice. Very Good \$995.

1890 – *LORIN G. PARMELEE* sale by NEW YORK COIN AND STAMP. Plated with 13 plates, including an 1861 Paquet Philadelphia double eagle, along with virtually every other rarity you can think of. This copy is hand-priced and bound in cloth and boards with original covers. The plate of 12 gold coins has been folded at one time. Fine. \$1250.

1864 – *JOHN F. McCOY* sale by W.E. WOODWARD. One of the most important offerings of American coinage from the early years. This copy has the original covers with a minor tape repair on the rear, and is in very fine condition..... \$525.

1908 – *JAMES B. WILSON* sale by THOMAS ELDER. This is a nice very copy with 28 fresh plates. Strong in U.S. coinage and one of the more desirable 20th century American catalogues. Comes with an original Prices Realized list. The ANA library recently purchased a copy of this sale from the Stack's library and paid \$1200 plus a 15% BUYER'S FEE. Ours is much better deal for less than half that at..... \$595.

1922 – *TEN EYCK* sale by B. MAX MEHL. One of Mehl’s best early sales. Comes with six bright plates, and is hand-priced. A non-original hardbound copy from the Ford Library brought over \$1000 . This is missing the covers, but is otherwise complete.. \$225.

1869 – *VARIETIES OF THE COPPER ISSUES OF US MINT OF THE YEAR 1794* by EDWARD MARIS. The very first published monograph on U.S. Large Cents. Less than 20 copies are known. This very fine example is from the recent Stack’s Library sale, and is desirable as such..... \$2500.

1890 – *THOMAS CLENEAY* by S.H. & H. CHAPMAN. Twelve fine photographic plates with a prices realized list bound in. This copy was in the John Ford library for many years and is bound in later red cloth with gilt lettering. Near new condition throughout..... \$2450.

1876 & 1879 – *COIN COLLECTOR’S JOURNAL* Two volumes in original blue publisher’s cloth..... \$95.

1941 – *WILLIAM F. DUNHAM* by B. MAX MEHL. Hardbound later with cloth and leather boards, and original front cover pasted in. Purchased by Harry Bass from Abe Kosoff on 7-30-1968. Hand-priced throughout and accompanied by a printed Prices Realized list bound in the back. Perhaps Mehl’s finest effort \$495.
