**Leary's Reckoner and Coin Book, 1859.** Numerous line drawings of U.S. and world coins, and tables of interest. Loose front cover.....\$30.

**Leary's Reckoner and Coin Book, 1860.** Covers fine.....\$40.

**Color Poster of the Wes Rasmussen Collection of United States Large Cents, 2'x 3' in frame.....\$60.**

Macerated National Currency, 4-inch round U.S. Capitol building with red, white, and blue ribbon attached. Made by the National Currency Souvenir Company out of "money redeemed and destroyed by U.S. Treasury.".....\$250.

**2-foot poster** specimen sheet of "**Bank-Note Engraving by Rawdon-Wright-Hatch & Edson of New Orleans.**" It has approximately 100 vignettes illustrated on it. A fascinating souvenir reprint printed by the American Banknote Company in 1979. Comes with frame.....\$175.

**1781 Land Grant** document made out to **David Rittenhouse** by the Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Signed by William Moore, President, and Timothy Matlack. Two seals in wax on the vellum parchment. This is the deed of five lots in Philadelphia for the Rittenhouse mansion that was near the first United States mint. Comes with gold toned frame.....\$1295.
